Summary of Position:

Collaboratively work with partner agencies to execute the Summer Work Program. This program works with high school age students (14-21) over 8 weeks of the summer. The Coordinator will assist in the implementation of the program and supervise approximately 10 youth and a Peer Mentor. Youth will work at job placements in group settings doing trail maintenance or at individual job sites. Additionally, the coordinator will plan and implement education and safety training days at the beginning of the program and during the course of the summer on Friday afternoons. This position works closely with the Recreation and Employment Specialist to ensure the health and safety of students participating in activities.

Responsibilities and Duties:

- Plan and teach job skills classes to groups of participants
- Plan and teach bear and tool safety training classes to a group of participants.
- Respond to students needing behavioral support while on trail
- Lead initiative games, team building and adventure activities to teach soft skills to participants
- Offer quality leadership that results in the safest and most fun possible
- Provide assistance in the day to day management of activities and programs
- Supervise the Peer Mentor
- Maintain confidential program records, e.g. participant information forms, evaluation forms, mailing lists and correspondence
- Responsible for working with the Employment and Recreation Specialist in executing safe and quality experiences for the participants
- Responsible for upkeep and management of program equipment
- Complete any follow up reports and database management for the program.
- Carry out other assignments as required
